Dear Ms. Morrison:

This inquiry came to the Board's attention by receipt of a copy of a June 14 letter you sent to a City Council member. It concerns the campaign fundraising activities of that elected official. The inquiry is not submitted by way of the usual inquiry form, but the Board will not delay its review of the matter because of that discrepancy. (Section 7.2 of the Board's procedures states that an inquiry must be submitted "in writing").

Your inquiry describes campaign fundraisers and direct campaign donations made by proponents of a rezoning proposal currently before the City Council. You characterize these donations as "political gifts", state that the integrity of the process has been compromised, and declare that the elected official has "a direct conflict of interest" and should recuse from further participation in the rezoning process.

Section 13-3(C) of the city Ethics Code contains the general restriction regarding the acceptance of gifts by city officers and employees. It states that, subject to certain narrow exceptions,

"...a City officer or employee shall not directly or indirectly solicit, accept or agree to accept any gift or favor, whether in the form of money, services, loans, travel, entertainment, hospitality, material items, promise or any other form, under circumstances in which it could reasonably be inferred that the gift was intended to influence such City officer or employee, or could reasonably expected to influence such City officer or employee, in the performance of his or her official duties or was intended as a reward for any official action taken by such City officer or employee...."

The term "gift or financial benefit", as defined in section 13-2, includes

"...anything of value, including, but not limited to, money, services, referrals, discounts, licenses, permits, contracts, authorizations, loans, travel, entertainment, hospitality, or any other gratuity or promise thereof. A financial transaction may be a financial benefit but shall

not be a gift unless it is on terms not available to the general public. "Gift" and "financial benefit" do not include campaign contributions authorized by law." (italics added).

Since the Ethics Code expressly excludes campaign contributions from the definition of "gift", the Board finds that the receipt of a campaign contribution by a city elected official under the circumstances you describe does not constitute a violation of the gift provisions in the Code.

Enclosed please find a copy of the standard inquiry form. If you wish to submit additional information the Board invites you to use that form in future correspondence.
